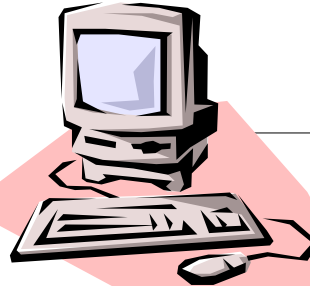

HEIN ONLINE CONTINUES TO GROW

We have two new databases available through our subscription to Hein Online. First up: **English Reports, Full Reprint, 1220-1865**. These reports are searchable by the English Reports Citation (e.g., 77 Eng. Rep. 1283), the case name, or the nominative citation (e.g., 2 Wils. K.B. 137).

Next, we have the **Foreign and International Law Resources Database (FILRD)**. This exciting new database includes publications from the American Society of International Law and prominent Yearbooks from around the world (Africa to New Zealand), as well as the Hague Permanent Court of International Justice series and U.S. Law Digests.

Also available: **World Trials**. Find full-text of works such as *American State Trials*; a *Collection of the Important and Interesting*

Criminal Trials Which Have Taken Place in the United States from the Beginning of Our Government to the Present Day, 1914-1936; Assassination of Abraham Lincoln by Osborn H. Oldroyd, 1901; *Case of Sacco and Vanzetti: A Critical Analysis for Lawyers and Laymen* by Felix Frankfurter, 1927; *Treatise on Trial by Jury, Including Questions of Law and Fact, With an Introductory Chapter on the Origin and History of Jury Trial* by John Proffatt, 1877; *Guilty or Not Guilty? An Account of the Trials of the Leo Frank Case, the D.C. Stephenson Case, the Samuel Insull Case, the Alger Hiss Case* by Francis X. Busch, 1952.

Don't forget that Hein Online provides easy access to all years of the **Federal Register** and the **Code of Federal Regulations** from 1938-1983 (all years to follow). Current **Session Laws** for all states are online, with prior years being back-filled. The **Treaties and Agreements Library** includes *Treaties In Force, 1929-2006* and the *Treaties and International Acts Series* from 1982-1996.

Statistics show that the GGU law school community has accessed Hein Online's journals database over 10,000 times in the past year. Make yourself familiar with these other offerings from this great resource.

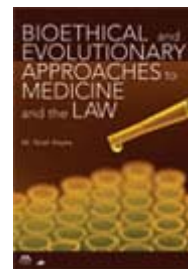
