

GGU/UPX Paris Summer Comparative Law Program 2008

Credit, Enrollment, and Grading

Enrollment Limits

- The program will be limited to 60 US/Canadian/common law students and 40 E.U./civil law students.
- It is anticipated that most E.U. students participating in the program will be French nationals but that several other European countries will be represented.
- The Introduction to French and European Union law (June 3-13) (2 credits) will be limited to 60 students (US, Canadian and other common law students only).
- The four five specialized comparative law courses (June 17-June 28) will be limited to 25 students each. Some students may not receive their first choice from among these five courses.

Credits

- US/Canadian/common law students will earn 4 semester units of credit from Golden Gate University School of Law.
- E.U. students may arrange for credits through UPX.
- It is unlikely that participation in a foreign summer program may be used to accelerate graduation. Students interested in acceleration should contact their home schools to review this issue in light of ABA Standard 305, Interpretation 4.

Student Performance and Grading

- Students will be expected to attend all class meetings, to prepare for class by reading the assigned material, and to participate in class discussions.
- Grades will be based on a two-hour in-class exam administered on the final Friday of each session.
- GGU permits faculty to award the following grades: A, A-, B, B-, C, C-, D, F
- No mandatory grading curve will apply to these courses.
- Acceptance of any grade or credit for any course taken in the program is subject to a determination by the student's home school.
