THE INTERNATIONAL WOMEN JUDGES GRADUATE FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

The Golden Gate University International Women Judges Graduate Fellowship Program was created to advance issues involving international women's rights and the role of women in justice systems around the world.

Sponsored by the Golden Gate University School of Law in partnership with the International Association of Women Judges, this program is made possible through the generosity of Elizabeth Cabraser of Lief Cabraser Heimann & Bernstein, LLP and Robert Kaufman, former president of the Association of the Bar of the City of New York and a partner at Proskauer Rose LLP.

In its inaugural year, the Golden Gate University International Women Judges Graduate Fellowship Program will select a woman jurist from a developing country to live in San Francisco, attend Golden Gate University School of Law, and complete a nine-month program of individualized coursework to earn a graduate law degree.

The visiting jurist will be admitted into one of the Law School's post-JD programs and may choose among LLM programs in Environmental Law, Intellectual Property Law, International Legal Studies, Taxation Law, and United States Legal Studies. Golden Gate Law will waive all tuition and fees and provide up to \$20,000 in living expenses.

The Fellow will have opportunities to engage and educate the Golden Gate Law School and local legal communities in a series of programs and activities organized around issues affecting women and women judges in her home country. The Law School will also provide ample networking and professional opportunities with the San Francisco legal community, state and federal courts, and with the Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Services (JAMS).

The application deadline is July 1, 2010, and the inaugural Fellow will begin coursework in August 2010.
