Policies & Procedures for Transfer or Application of Units to LLM Programs

1. Students must obtain approval from their LLM program directors before any units/courses may be transferred into GGU from any law school. If seeking approval to visit away, students must submit this form prior to registering for courses at another law school, along with course descriptions for all courses they wish to take, to their LLM program directors.
2. Generally, LLM students may transfer in only courses completed prior to matriculating in the LLM program. Depending on the LLM program, the program director may grant permission to current GGU LLM students to visit away at another law school and transfer up to six (6) units of related courses into the LLM program.
3. For courses to be transferable, students must receive grades equivalent to a “C” or better, as determined by the law school registrar at GGU. Grades equivalent to a “C-” or lower are not transferable and the units will not count toward graduation. Students who receive grades equivalent to a “C-” or “D” may petition their LLM program directors to be allowed to receive credit for these courses at GGU.
4. Students who earned a JD degree at GGU may apply up to nine (9) units of related courses towards the following LLM academic programs: Environmental Law, Intellectual Property Law, International Legal Studies, or U.S. Legal Studies. Students who earned a JD degree at GGU may apply up to twelve (12) units of taxation courses towards the LLM in Taxation academic program.
5. Students who have earned an LLM degree at GGU may apply up to six (6) units of courses in which a grade of “B-” or better was earned towards a second LLM degree.
6. Students who attended an LLM Program at another ABA-approved law school may transfer up to six (6) units of related courses in which a grade of “B-” or better was earned into the GGU LLM program.
7. Students must ensure their host institutions send official transcripts of all courses taken for transfer credit directly to the GGU Law School Registrar’s Office. The transcripts must include or be accompanied by the other law school’s grading policy or system. Failure to provide an official transcript in a timely manner may delay graduation and/or certification for bar exams.
