



WHAT YOU'LL FIND	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Proquest</b> is a tool that can be used to access a number of varying publications. Resources include Newspaper, Magazine, and Journal Articles, Abstracts, Citations, and Theses and Dissertations. <b>Full text</b> options may include text with graphics or PDF versions. Subjects covered include a number of areas including business, social sciences, science and technology, and humanities.</li> <li>• <b>Proquest</b> includes <b>ProQuest Dissertations and Theses</b> as well as full text access to <b>The Wall Street Journal, The New York Times, The Economist, Time, Newsweek, and US News and World Report.</b></li> </ul>
WHO CAN ACCESS IT?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students, faculty, GGU staff, and alumni can access this database on campus. Currently enrolled students and faculty can access <b>Proquest</b> from home, work, or any computer with internet access. HOW TO SEARCH	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Proquest</b> will automatically open in the <b>Advanced Search</b> mode. <b>Advanced Search</b> lets you search for multiple terms using search boxes. Search by subject, document title, author, and other areas indicated by a drop down menu to the right of the search box. Select specific databases in <b>Advanced Search</b> mode while also specifying a distinct date range. Additionally, you may limit your search to <b>scholarly journals</b>.</li> <li>• <b>Proquest</b> also offers a <b>Topic Guide</b> found by clicking the <b>Topics</b> tab. This allows you to enter a keyword, term, or phrase. Once submitted, <b>Proquest</b> will offer topic suggestions. This is good for <b>browsing</b> or discovering <b>search terms</b> by narrowing your search with related topic terms. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You can conduct a <b>Publication Search</b> through <b>Proquest</b> to browse or search within issues of a particular publication.</li> <li>• Before searching, develop a <b>search strategy</b> by brainstorming key terms related to your topic.</li> <li>• <b>Evaluate sources</b> as you go. Keep in mind when the document was published, if it was published in a scholarly journal, how long it is, and what subject headings are used to describe it.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
VIEWING YOUR RESULTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You can view an article by clicking on the title or by clicking on the icon options below the title. These options include Text with Graphics, Text, PDF, or Find a Copy. Clicking on <b>Find a Copy</b> will take you to a screen that will allow you to search in other GGU databases for the article you need.</li> <li>• As you are searching, clicking the marked item box to the left of the citations in your results list will save that record for later use. When you have completed your search, you can hit the tab called <b>My Research</b> to access all of your marked records. In this area you can <b>Create a Bibliography, E-mail Marked Documents, Export Citations, or Create a Webpage.</b></li> </ul>
CITING	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• You can download, print, or e-mail marked citations in the <b>My Research</b> tab by clicking <b>Create a bibliography</b>. You can specify format and citation style.</li> <li>• Although <b>Proquest</b> will create citations in a number of different styles (including APA and MLA), it is always a good idea to double check the citations as there are often errors in the style outputs.</li> <li>• Here is a sample APA citation of an article found through Proquest: Jacoby, J. &amp; O'Brien, N.P. (2005, July). Assessing the impact of reference services provided to undergraduate students. <i>College &amp; Research Libraries</i>, 66(4), 324-340.
